Student began to insult the other Student, telling him that no one liked him and that he needed to share the TV or just leave. Angered by the insults, he stepped off to the perimeter of the campus to smoke a cigarette and calm down. At this time. The TV was moved to the table in which one of the Students and his friends located. Shortly after the other Student returned to the common area and grabbed the TV. The other Student tried to grab the TV to keep him from taking it. An argument ensued and both Students to step outside. They went outside the west exit between the Richardson Performance Hall and the Harvin Center. One student claimed that the other shoved him while on the way out, and again shoved him when both exited the building. The Student then placed one of his hands on the other student's neck and on the collarbone. The other Student reciprocated the same action to resist. Student claimed that he attempted to break free of him, which led to the Student pinning the other on the railing near the sidewalk. At this time, a witness student began recording the altercation on his phone as he stepped outside with his friends and began shouting at The Students involved in the altercation that The First Student was acting in self-defense and that the incident was being recorded. The Other Student slapped the phone out of his hand.</p> <p>Then claimed that he then punched the other Student to free himself. Continued grasp against the railing student was pinned against. Student then retaliated with a punch. The witness friends informed S/O that he attempted to deescalate the situation verbally, then pulled the Students away. After the altercation, The Student returned to the common area while the witness reported the physical altercation to (DMC Staff) in room 105. S/O asked if either parties were injured.
